Seasonal Load Restrictions

The reduced load period in Springwater starts March 1 and ends April 30. By-law 2009-079 restricts loads on most Township roads to 5 tonnes per axle.

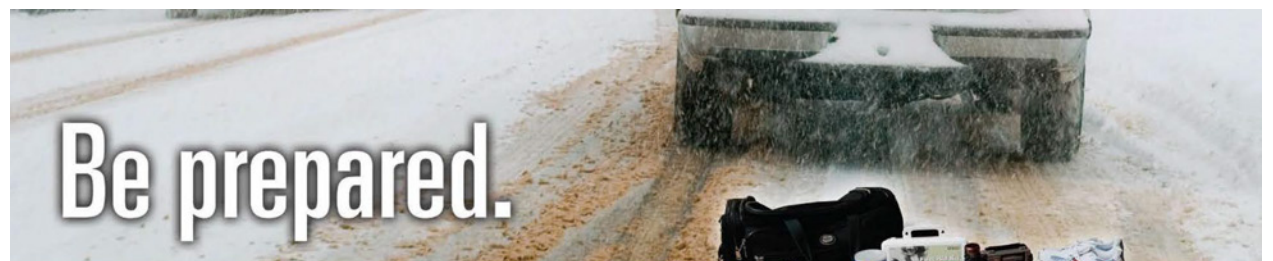
